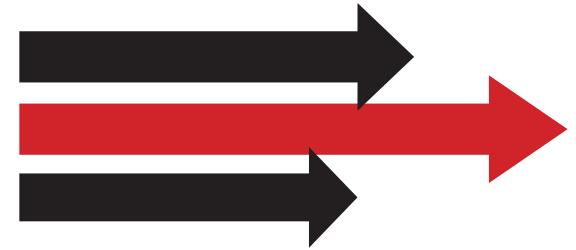

Increasing Access via Mentoring

(I AM) Program is an action based intensive mentoring model where staff & graduate students from USC guide college-ready high school seniors through the college and financial aid application processes.

OUR GOALS ARE:

- » To increase the college-going population at the target high school by 10-25%.
- » To increase college-going for CSU- and UC-eligible high school seniors in these schools with historically low college-going rates. Further, the program will ensure that student participants are not only admitted to a four-year institution, but are prepared for the transition from high school to college.

WHAT DOES A MENTEE (STUDENT) HAVE TO DO?

- » Meet with mentor 1-3 times a month
- » Keep in contact through email, phone, or in-person
- » Attend monthly meetings held by the program
- » Submit requested documents

WHAT DOES A MENTOR HAVE TO DO?

- » Spend a minimum of 3-4 hours per month one-on-one with a mentee
- » Work on college admissions requirements and discuss “college knowledge” (majors, living on campus, organization, college life)
- » Help set goals and ensure that students meet college admissions deadlines
